### PASTOR'S MESSAGE: JOSEPH

The stories about the events related to the birth and early life of Jesus are known as the Infancy Narratives and found in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. In the Gospel of Luke, the accounts have Mary (or her relatives) as the main character, while in Matthew's Gospel, Joseph plays the more prominent role. This has led some Bible scholars to speculate this is because the stories come from two different traditions. Although the ones which feature Mary tend to be better known, the ones focusing on Joseph are equally important. The genealogy (family tree) which begins Matthew's Gospel shows how Jesus is connected to Abraham (the founder of the Jewish people) and David (the person most associated with the coming Messiah). When Joseph chose not divorce Mary (as the Jewish Law expected) he made his divinely conceived son a legitimate member of the Jewish people. His actions to move Mary and the infant Jesus to Egypt after learning of Herod's plot to kill his son and then to Nazareth to protect him from the king's heir, highlighted Joseph's role as protector of the Holy Family and obedient servant of God. During these events, there is little indication of what Joseph thought or felt as they unfolded. It likely that he was confused when he learned his wife was pregnant and he knew he was not the child's biological father. He was probably baffled when the wise men (strangers) from the East showed up unexpectedly at his door with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh for his son and paid homage to him. Joseph was likely afraid when he learned of Herod's plot to kill his son, wife and himself. There may have been moments when he wondered what he had gotten himself into by agreeing to be part of God's plan. Yet, Joseph trusted that somehow things would work out and they did. He obediently did what he was asked to do by God and that might have provided some comfort to Mary who could have been equally unsettled. Two thousand years later, we often face situations like those which confronted Joseph. We don't understand what is happening around us. We seem to have little ability to control events. The future frightens us. But, like Joseph, we trust God will make things work out..
