PASTOR'S MESSAGE: MAGI

The term "Magi" is often used to identify the wise men who visited Jesus in Bethlehem after his birth, as recorded in Matthew's Gospel. The Greek historian Thucydides linked "Magi" with members of a Persian class/tribe some of whom interpreted dreams and heavenly signs as well as acted in Priestly roles when offering sacrifice. Astrology, the attempt to connect earthly and heavenly events, was a common practise in Ancient Middle Eastern cultures, although it was condemned by the Jewish Law. The new star (likely the conjunction of three planets) was seen as the sign of an important event by the wise men who may have had knowledge of a future leader gained from Jewish sources who were scattered throughout the region. Their lack of knowledge about the details concerning this individual was shown by their not knowing his birthplace (they assumed he would be born in the capital Jerusalem). Their desire to find Christ for non-earthly reasons, while lacking the correct religious knowledge, contrasts sharply with Herod who has the right information but whose motivation to locate the child is solely a temporal one (the elimination of a rival). The story is a reminder to Catholics, the desire to seek Christ (or God) may originate from unlikely sources. The possession of the "correct theology" is no guarantee one will encounter Christ in one's life. The important thing is to have a sincere desire to seek to truth and follow it wherever it leads. Since as Vatican II teaches, the fullness of truth subsists in the Catholic Church, that is where Christ will be found. Yet, it is essential to allow people to follow their own faith journey, providing guidance at times, but always respecting their religious freedom. At a time when some religious traditions are adopting a black or white stance about religious truth, this seems a challenging idea to embrace. Yet, the Magi provide an example of how it works.
