PASTOR'S MESSAGE: LAMB OF GOD

"Lamb of God" is a term used by John the Baptist to identify Jesus. Within the Hebrew Scriptures/Old Testament, lambs were seen as sacrificial victims offered not only at Passover but also on daily and Sabbath occasions. Lambs were also sacrificed during the Ordination Rite for Priests, as a Peace Offerings and in atonement for sin. Elsewhere, lambs were associated with goodness, those in need of care, gentleness, peace and prosperity. In the Christian Scriptures/New Testament, the sacrificial role is taken on by Christ whose mission is to bear humanity's sins. John the Baptist makes this clear by adding the phrase "who takes away the sins of the world" after calling Jesus the "Lamb of God". It also suggests a connection between Christ and the Suffering Servant found in the writings of Isaiah. In the Book of Revelation, the Lamb is the one whose blood purifies sinners and sits at God's throne. Disciples are also called lambs who are fed by Jesus and who will also become sacrificial victims as they carry out their mission. For Christ's followers in modern times, the sacrifices demanded of them may be as great as that of a lamb. Sadly, in many parts of the world, Christians are killed because of their religious beliefs. It has been suggested, more Christians have died for their faith during the Twentieth Century, than in all previous centuries combined. While most Christians in Canada do not face this situation, they are often required to offer other sacrifices. When voicing their opinions about certain social issues like abortion, they are drowned out by a hostile media. Their beliefs and practices are ridiculed by a secular culture. Some governments are trying to remove any public display of religious beliefs. It is hard to be a person of faith these days. Each time at Mass, when Catholics pray the Gloria, Lamb of God and Prayer Before Communion, (which all use the term Lamb of God), they are reminded their sacrifices are a continuation of that offered by Jesus on the cross. From that connection, they can draw strength to persevere by recognizing they are not alone. Christ suffers with them. So does the Church which sees value in what they offer even if society does not.
